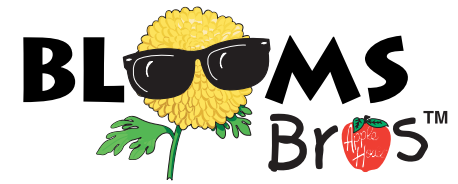

		<p><b>1</b> <b>2</b></p> <h3>Timely Tips for Tasty Tomatoes</h3> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Dark leathery spots on basal or blossom end of tomatoes is caused by lack of calcium in the fruit.</li> <li>• Use liquid calcium spray for a quick solution and to insure juicy tomatoes in your garden.</li> </ul>			<p><b>3</b> <b>4</b></p> <h3>Water Well!</h3> <p>Did you plant new trees or shrubs this season? Continue deep soaking weekly through mid October.</p> 	
<p><b>5</b> <b>6</b></p> <h3>In the Garden</h3> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Early blight, septoria leaf spots on tomatoes can be controlled by Fungonil Fungicide.</li> <li>• Tomato leaf roll is caused by too much moisture. Let the soil dry to correct this problem.</li> </ul>		<p><b>7</b></p>  <p>Disbudding Dahlias now can extend flowering into October</p>	<p><b>8</b> <b>9</b></p> <h3>HOT August Days Mean Extra Watering!</h3> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Lawns - its best to water in the morning to prevent disease.</li> <li>• Landscape plants and flowers - be sure to get plenty water to the root zone to be effective.</li> </ul>		<p><b>10</b> <b>11</b></p> <h3>Remove Bag Worms NOW</h3> <p>to cut down on next year's infestation</p>

Consider putting up a bat house. Bats are voracious predators of all these pesky flying insects. A single bat will eat over 2,000 insects every day! Mount your bat house on a 12' - 16' pole facing East or Southeast.</p>

<p><b>August/Early September</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Attack weeds by applying Bonide Lawn Weed Killer</li> <li>• Apply Grub Control if needed.</li> </ul>		<p><b>Early/Mid September</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Overseed bare or thin areas with Blooms Bros. Premium Turf Seed.</li> <li>• Spot kill any remaining weeds in late September.</li> </ul>		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Feed lawn with Greenview GreenStart or Fairway Fall Lawn Food.</li> <li>• Detach and Aerate as needed.</li> <li>• Water lawn if needed.</li> </ul>		<p><b>Mid October</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Apply Greenview Fairway Fall Formula.</li> </ul>
